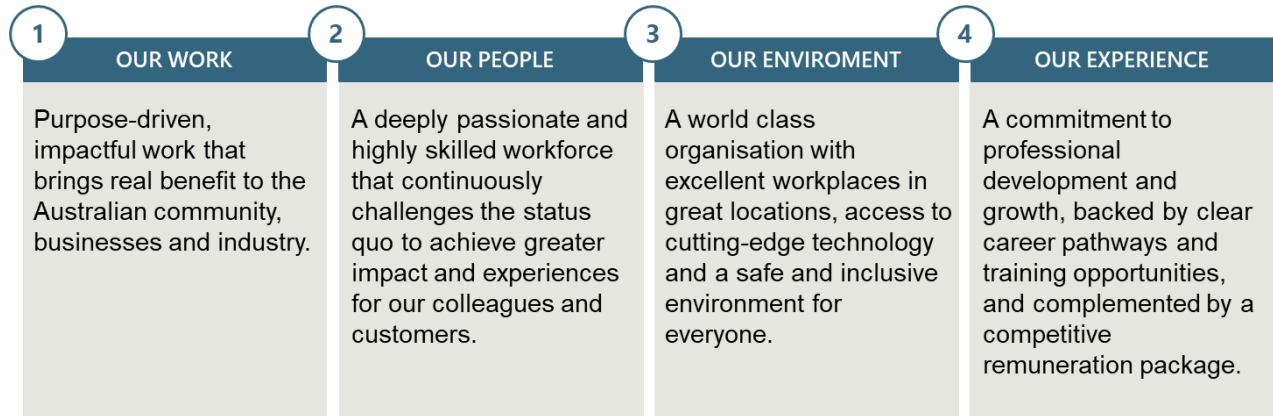

WORKING AT THE BUREAU

The Bureau represents a dynamic and exciting opportunity. A role with the Bureau involves:



POSITION OVERVIEW

The Cyber Security Risk & Compliance Advisor reports to the Manager, Cyber Security Awareness and Assurance. This role has been established for 18 months – 2 years on a non-ongoing basis.

The Cyber Security Risk & Compliance Advisor is expected to support the business in managing risk and meeting compliance obligations through a range of activities. The role requires experience in audit, governance and risk management, including across ISM accreditation / IRAP audit activity.

Knowledge and experience working with the ISM and the PSPF framework as applied to the Australian Government organisations is highly desirable.

ROLE RESPONSIBILITIES

Reporting to the Cyber Security Awareness and Assurance Manager, the responsibilities of the Cyber Security Risk & Compliance Advisor will include, but are not limited to:

1. Contribute to the security risk management programs, working closely with all areas of the organisation to ensure the protection of information assets.
2. Provide advice on compliance with Protective Security Policy Framework (PSPF), ISM and the NIST Cyber Security Framework (CSF).
3. Conduct audit and assurance activities to drive control assessment to monitor adherence to various information security policy and standards.
4. Manage the annual security control testing, collate and report results against all applicable risk and maturity frameworks.
5. Manage tracking, maintaining, verifying and reporting non-conformance and corrective action/s as part of the assurance program of work.
6. Maintain Cyber Security Risk Registers to continuously track and drive mitigation and resolution efforts.
7. Adhere to the Bureau's plans, policies and practices in relation to the various elements of the Bureau's Social Justice Strategy.
8. Undertake other duties as directed.



SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Understanding of a broad range of IT systems security risk concepts, trends and practices.
2. Knowledge and understanding of information risks, concepts, principles and industry standards relevant to information security risk management
3. Proficiency in the information security risk management discipline within relevant industry sector.
4. Proficiency in performing risk, business impact, control and vulnerability assessments, and in defining treatment strategies.
5. Technical understanding of the NIST CSF, business processes, security governance, audit compliance and risk assessment.
6. Ability to contribute to short, medium- and long-term planning and effectively promote ideas, and set goals and priorities in line with business objectives.
7. An excellent standard of verbal, presentation and written communication skills, including customer service and strong interpersonal skills.
8. The ability to effectively convey security risks to technical and non-technical stakeholders.
9. Demonstrated ability to effectively and efficiently prioritise workload, and consistently meet deadlines.
10. Understanding of the [Bureau's diversity and inclusion statement of commitment](#) and [APS Values and Code of Conduct](#)

Mandatory qualifications (if applicable):
